



Emergency medical technicians, or EMTs, work in an ambulance and respond to emergency situations.

EMT's work with emergency medical technician-advance and emergency medical technician-paramedics in an ambulance, and with anyone they are assisting.

Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) - Tasks

- Administer basic first-aid treatment and life-support care to sick or injured persons in prehospital setting.
- Perform emergency diagnostic and treatment procedures, such as blood pressures, blood glucose reading and provide support for the EMT or Paramedic.
- Coordinate work with other emergency medical team members, police and fire department personnel.
- Assess nature and extent of illness or injury to establish and prioritize medical procedures.
- Maintain vehicles and medical and communication equipment, and replenish first-aid equipment and supplies.
- The ability to lift over 200 lbs. +
- The ability to work in various temperatures, indoor & outdoor work environment.
- Follow our progressive knowledge of medical protocols
 - Complete patient care reports which support Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) guidelines
 - Be able to effectively, professionally, and compassionately work with citizens from various backgrounds
- Valid Driver's License with an acceptable driving record
- The ability to drive an ambulance and to obey all of the state of Georgia driving regulations
- The ability to make quick decision making at all times.
- Completes and transfers patient care information and records as per established procedures.
- Inspects emergency medical equipment to ensure serviceability and compliance with safety and infection control regulations and standards.
